

· Three Bridges - footbridge, along beach past 1942 pill box, across airfield, Aerodrome Bridge, Wainui Rd bridge - can also join with Kaitoke walkway and make a larger circular by using Cross St. John St and Cliff St.

· Lorenzen Bay-Wharf at mid to low tide, or use the steps to Daisy St, or Bayview Rd. A bit muddy in places.

regularly - as with these cyclists on the bike4lanes

ride in 2009 – there's still no cycle lanes in Raglan, so it's usually unsafe to ride 2 or more abreast.

- · Lorenzen Bay-Greenslade Rd at mid to low tide (too rocky for cycling) walkways from beach beside 48, 98 and 116 Greenslade Rd. Can also vary this walk, or escape a rising tide, by using the walkways linking to Cambrae Rd, Bay View Rd, or Daisy St.
- · Park Dr to Lily St through the bush and Lily St to the Wharf with good views from the steps. The paper road to Primrose St is overgrown, but passable.
- · Follow the Town Centre, or Three Wharves Heritage Walks (leaflets at Information Centre, which also has leaflets about Friends of Wainui Reserve and Wainui Reserve).
- · Follow the Opotoru trail (details from Bike2Bay 825 0309) which is always open on the harbourside and at weekends to Maungatawhiri Rd (number 276), which starts from the first gate on the right after crossing the Opotoru causeway.
